Definition of Terms

BB – engineering, program, computer software (including hardware) and/or, contract, service, or other provider it relates to the equipment of the Procuring Entity as stated in the Bidding Documents. (RR of RA No. 1201, Section 122)

BBB – a supplier, manufacturer, contractor, consultant, and service provider, whether public or private, who submit a BB in response to the requirements of the Procuring Entity provided in the Bidding Documents. (RR of RA No. 1201, Section 122)

Bidding Documents – the documents issued by the Procuring Entity as the basis for BB, furnishing of information necessary to prospective bidders to prepare a BB for the Goods, Infrastructure Projects, and Consulting Services required by the Procuring Entity. (RR of RA No. 1201, Section 123)

Bill of Materials – a list of the quantities and of the prices and their corresponding unit prices, and amount of bills of materials used.

Consulting Services – services for infrastructure projects and other types of projects or activities of the government or its agencies, including technical assistance and professional fees that may be based on the quantity or quality of the government's activities such as, but not limited to, studies and research, design, construction management, and other services and the other technical services in projects studies. (RR of RA No. 1201, Section 123)

Contract – the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Contractor to execute, complete, and maintain the works and as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties in fulfillment of their obligations and specified provisions of documents incorporated by reference thereto.

Contract Price – the price stated in the notice of award and hereafter to be paid by the Procuring Entity to the Contractor for the execution of the work in accordance with the contract.

Contract Time Extension (CTE) – the allowable period for the Contractor to complete the work in addition to the agreed completion period in the contract.

Contractor – a natural or juridical entity which entered into contract with the Procuring Entity and to whom the contract is awarded for work and services. Contractor as used in these Bidding Documents shall refer to a supplier, contractor, manufacturer or consultant.

COTC – Office of Contract Administration and Control Office

Dayswork – work performed subject to payment of a fixed fee for the Contractor's services and equipment, in addition to payments for material, fuel, oil and Tyre.

Defect – any part of the work not completed in accordance with the Contract.

Defect Liability Certificate – the certificate issued by the Procuring Entity upon completion of defect by the contractor.

Defect Liability Period – the one (1) year period between contract completion and final acceptance, while which the Contractor assumes the responsibility to undertake the repair of any damage to the works at its own expense.

Drawings – graphical representations of the works. They must be supplemented with other drawings, such as plans, a topographical plan when provided or as usual for the execution of the works.

Effective Date of the Contract – the date indicated in the contract. However, the Contract shall commence performance of its obligations only upon receipt of the Notice to Proceed.

Foreign-based Insurance and Foreign-based Third-Party – either is the acquisition of Goods, Consulting Services, and the contracting for technical assistance by the Government of the Philippines, or (a) an entity formally bonded by foreign banks or banks in countries having a membership in the Contracting Agreement.

Funding Source – Organization named in the BIDD.

Goods – all of (a) all items, supplies, and materials, whether in the nature of equipment, building materials, materials for construction, or goods or property of any kind needed in the execution of these agreements or in the interest of the government's enterprise, except (a) (i) goods or supplies and materials which are the direct result of manufacturing services and infrastructure projects, such as the repair and maintenance of equipment and facilities as well as building, heavy projects, and the need of engineering services. **Procured Goods or Materials** – all of (a) goods or materials which are not for the defense, health, or safety of any person or thing.

Infrastructure Projects – include the construction, improvement, rehabilitation, operation, repair, expansion, or maintenance of roads and bridges, airports, seaports, harbors, canals, water facilities, and water control works of the water and irrigation, navigation, flood control and drainage, water supply, sanitation, sewerage and solid waste management systems, power generation, energy transmission and distribution facilities, telecommunications, school buildings, health buildings, and other related construction projects of the government. This includes all the work of water, sewer, drainage, and flood control (Sector 4).

Lot – refers to a tract of land or a portion thereof which is sold together with or without, such as crops, animals, or other movable personal or immovable properties of a particular lot of the Property. Each lot is distinct when the land and the buildings are separately owned.

Notice – refers to the formal notice of the completion of construction when the contractor has the work completed as he agreed, or he orders the suspension of the work in the technical requirements and the work shall be regarded as finished in the physical construction of the work, considered complete.

Notice to Proceed – refers to all permits, including certificates, and for the Contractor to commence the work.

Notice to Suspend – refers to the formal notice of the suspension of construction when the contractor has the work completed as he agreed, or he orders the suspension of the work in the technical requirements, and the suspension of the work immediately when requested – refers to the quality control system of the construction work, considering the law.

Notice to Proceed – refers to a written order issued by the Financing Bank, to the Contractor requiring the latter to begin the commencement of the work not later than a specified or predetermined date.

Order submitter: persons & the successors of the estate (trusts, estates, etc.) of persons currently in a custodial and financial protection of the state through electronic means as through the electronic filing facility of the PT-CERT, also a trustee.

Permanent House - refers to all permanent structures and all other owned facilities and facilities that will be constructed and connected to sewerage with the consent upon application received in the Pricing City, and as a final report in the link after the removal of the Permanent House.

Simple Infrastructure Projects – refers to construction improvements, rehabilitation, operation, repair, replacement, or maintenance of structures, technical facilities and systems with an approved budget for the current FISCY for exceeding the total FISCY (P4) is 200,000,000. Such projects commonly arise from the requirements of laws and ordinances of the government and the community and is also arising from needs and the request of the community and others.

- a) In line with the principle of transparency and confidentiality and to ensure the widest possible dissemination thereof, as required by law, shall be included (annexed) by the Procuring Entity, for each (1) standard type of the Philippine Government Contract Procurement System (PCPPS) article in the contractual work intended for that purpose in the procurement Procurement, and (2) the scope of work shall conform to the Procuring Entity's standards, or such other changes as may be determined by the Procurement Management Policy Board (PPMB), and the details provided by the foreign government/agency or international financing institution, if available; and
- b) For justified reasons, Procuring Entity may limit number of bidders, procurement opportunities or bidders, such as the following, in each other cases not authorized by the Philippine government to be included in the procurement stage or procurement structure.

According to the applicable laws, under the Bidding Documents, the invitation to bid should also include the following:

- a) The availability of the bidding documents, which shall be provided for the use of the invitation to bid is to be included until the deadline for submission of bids (BID) and the deadline for submission of bids and receipt of bids;
- b) The place where the Bidding Documents may be provided in the website where it may be downloaded;
- c) The deadline for the submission of bids or offers;
- d) The procurement requirements; and
- e) The bid award considerations - e.g., the acceptance of a margin of the interest in the selection.

The invitation to bid may also be incorporated into the Bidding Documents. The information contained in the invitation to bid must conform to the Bidding Documents, particularly the award information in the BOD.

- 3.4. The model will take account of the fact that a change to the procurement project is based, and where it is feasible, subject to at least 90 percent (90%) of the FIDC, adjusted to current prices, using the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) consumer price index. However, having regard to the fact, around 20% of the contract is to be added, subject to the recommendation of the Financing Entity, which shall be submitted to the Board for consideration. However, further, the contractor, under Item A and Item B, shall have without time extension or the adjustment subject to be added may be subject to 10% of the cost of such contract if it is more than the estimated range of Contractor's final quotation based on the quantities as indicated by the FIDC.

For long-term contracts, the DFP and the foreign government, or design or construction financing institution, may agree on other methods for adjustment, as specified in the FIDC.

However, a contractor's responsibility for the procurement project is to be the same under categories of risk. The Financing Entity will verify the existing documents which represent their contracts of work, guided by the amount of performance and FIDC for review approval.

- 3.5. The FIDC will be supported by an Owner's Certificate of Final Acceptance based on the project completion letter for the Contractor, in a form subject to the satisfaction of the Contractor's performance throughout the term of FIDC, or a final performance and completion letter, in the case of contracts with the owner where the contractor's contract is completed.
- 3.6. The calculation of the value of FIDC payable at each date to the FIDC is as follows, subject to the fact:

12. From the date of the Contractor's agreement to the statement in the JGC Clause 1.2, the Pricing Entity will be deemed to have assumed the work of the Contractor. The resulting adjustment in connection to the work shall be paid by the Contractor with JGC Clause 44.

- 11) The Contractor incurs financial or real estate costs for facilities, materials, transportation, advance, or advance, becomes subject to the equipment of a facility, material, advance, material, or other, which is not included in the contract with the Contractor's advance, and is not included in any work order, which is subject to a new advance effecting an advance or a new work order applicable law.

- 12.3 After termination, the Contractor shall be entitled to payment of the amount of the value of the work executed and of the materials and work, in addition to the Cost of Work and D12, subject to the following:
 - (a) any work done by the Contractor is a direct cost of the Contractor;
 - (b) any work done by the Financing Entity is entitled.
- 12.4 The Contractor shall be liable for any loss or damage to the Contractor's property or the Contractor's property or the Contractor's property.

13. Termination by Contractor

14. Termination by Government

The Financing Entity, by written notice to the Contractor, may terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, at any time, if it has determined the substance of any of the following conditions has been contractually provided in accordance with the Contractor's obligations:

- e. If a loan and its terms contain no opportunity for the lender to increase the interest on larger amounts, *forwards*, or *backward* flows, as determined by the IMF or
- f. The IMF has determined the existence of conditions that make project implementation impractical or unnecessary, but are not included in, or above loans, through its own and government policies.

13. Termination for Development

The Financing Entity may terminate the contract in case it is determined upon force by the Contracting Institution is not in full compliance with the required letter of doing the implementation of the contract. 14. Termination for Other Causes

- 14.1 The Financing Entity may terminate the contract, if and only if, when any one of the conditions. The IMF may terminate the Contract for the convenience of the Financing Entity. In such event, it shall not be significantly changed so as to render the project no longer economically, financially, or technically feasible, as determined by the IMF, or if the IMF has determined the existence of conditions that make project implementation impractical or unnecessary, such as, but not limited to, financial events, changes in laws and government policies.
- 14.2 The Financing Entity or the Contracting Institution terminate the Contract if the other party causes a fundamental breach of the Contract.
- 14.3 Other breaches of Contract shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:
 - a. The Contracting Institution may not comply with the obligation of the Financing Entity to provide the required Project services and the stoppage has not been authorized by the Financing Entity.
 - b. The Financing Entity, terminate the Contract to take the advantage of the funds, it will be available to the institution until April 1978 (2019).
 - c. A payment within the Financing Entity, is required to the Contracting Institution with a physical, but does not have the law of the Financing Entity, certificate.

- e) The Planning Body gives notice that when it corrects a particular Defect it is doing so on the basis of Corrected and the Contractor has to correct it within a reasonable period of time determined by the Planning Body;
 - f) The Contractor does not receive a Defect, which is required, and
 - g) The Contractor has failed to correction of the Defects by the number of days for which the relevant amount of uncorrected Defects will be said as defined in the DCC 12.
- 26.4 The Planning Board is the Planning Body, as appropriate, set over the completion of administrative matters as prescribed by R.M. No. 1203 and where possible to the completion of administrative matters as prescribed under applicable agency rules and regulations intended to be moved efficiently, fully and, if possible, in a timely manner.
- 26.5 For as provided in other acts, in the Contractor's case of a functional defect to the Planning Body, in order to be treated as such, subject for a claim under this contract, under DCC, Clause 26.5, the Planning Body and other entities involved in the Contractor's case.
- 26.6 If the Contractor determines the Contractor's work is not satisfactory, then the Contractor must submit, on time, the Defect to be corrected, provided.

17) Procedures for Termination of Contract

- 17.1 The following procedure shall apply with the procedures for the termination of the Contract:
- a) Written notice - clear notice of the written report of the Contractor who may constitute grounds for termination as prescribed, or upon the completion of the notice or terminating contract, within a period of seven (7) calendar days, using the contents of such grounds and cause for termination of a written report, with an attached evidence attached.
 - b) Notice to Terminate - Upon recommendation by the Contractor to terminating with the work and/or services contract only by written notice to the Contractor concerning the termination of the contract. The notice shall give:
 - i) that the Contract is being terminated for any of the grounds enumerated, and a statement of the date the contract is the grounds listed, the Contractor;
 - ii) the actual termination, whether it is made or is not;
 - iii) as to whether the Contractor is now aware of it and the contract should be terminated, and
 - iv) specific instructions of the terminating work, if any.

The notice to terminate shall be accompanied by a copy of the written notice.

- 43. Issue of a Complaint to the Contracting Officer (CO) - The contractor shall file a complaint with the Office of the Contracting Officer, the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) or a verified customer support channel stating why the contract should not be terminated. A receipt of the Contracting Officer of the notice of the decision. The termination shall only be issued in the grounds stated in the notice to terminate.**
- 46. Contract Termination Notice - The HAFG shall create a termination notice to be issued to the contractor of the HAFG, which shall be the HAFG. An execution shall be made by the HAFG prior to award of the contract of the HAFG.**

An amended Contract Price will be included, accepted and confirmed by both the Procuring Entity and the Contractor.

25.2 If the Contractor has any proposals for an acceptance or acceptance, the Procuring Entity, they are incorporated in the Contract Price and become a variation.

10. Contractor's Right to Order

11. Deposits

21.3 The Contractor shall be paid for Deposits subject to receiving signed Deposits from the Procuring Entity and Contractor.

12. Early Warning

22.1 The Contractor shall give the Procuring Entity in the contract documents, if possible, the best possible or consideration for the contract, after the early order is issued, because the Contractor is, or may be, the owner of the work.

22.2 The Contractor shall cooperate with the Procuring Entity in issuing and completing proposals for the effect of such an event or consideration as to be accepted or issued in the contract. The Contractor shall cooperate with the Procuring Entity, shall such work or consideration as to be accepted or issued in the contract. - 11.3 The Procuring Entity may issue if the Program of Work when the under the Contractor's obligation. A revised Program of Work produced by the Contractor shall show the activities, sequence, resources, and shall include all variations. The Contractor may reschedule Program of Work, based on the variation orders, and submit it to the Procuring Entity again.
- 11.4 When the Program of Work is updated, the Contractor shall submit the Procuring Entity, with an update cost for the work. The cost for the work shall include different currency, as defined in the Contract, provided as necessary using the Contractor's exchange rates.

10. Management Conference

- 10.1 When the Procuring Entity or the Contractor may require the other to attend a Management Conference. The Management Conference shall include the plans for meeting and the other will attend in accordance with the same meeting procedure.
- 10.2 The Procuring Entity shall report the minutes of management conferences and a review copies of the report to the Procuring Entity and to the Contractor. The responsibility of the parties to the minutes to be taken shall be provided by the Procuring Entity after the Management Conference or after the Management Conference. The Procuring Entity shall communicate the minutes of the meeting to all parties to the Conference.

10. Bill of Materials

- 10.1 The Bill of Materials shall consist items of work by the contractor, including, but not limited to, quantities of work materials, and the following items, as required by the Contractor.
- 10.2 The Bill of Materials is used to calculate the Contract Price. The Contractor is paid for the quantity of the materials at the rate in the Bill of Materials for each item.
- 10.3 If the final quantity of any work item increases after the the quantity included in the Bill of Materials, and the difference does not exceed under the present (10%) of the original quantity for that item, the Procuring Entity shall issue the Contract billings.

The price shall be 10% of the net amount of the price changes that go beyond the present (10%) of the total Contract price, added to applicable taxes, costs, and expenses.

- 16.4 If requested by the Financing Entity, the Contractor shall provide the Financing Entity with a written confirmation of any one or more of the following:

16. Evaluation, Inspection and Audit

- 16.1 The Financing Entity and its or its authorized representative, completion of the review as set out in a written report, findings and any other information and documents, and to check the progress of the construction.
- 16.2 If the Financing Entity requests the Contractor to carry out a work not specified in the Specification to check whether any work has a defect and the Contractor has a work, the Contractor shall only do the work and the payment, in the absence of any defect, the Contractor shall not be liable for any work done in the absence of any defect, the Contractor shall not be liable for any work done in the absence of any defect, the Contractor shall not be liable for any work done in the absence of any defect.

18. Completion of Defects

- 18.1 The Financing Entity shall give notice to the Contractor of any defects before the end of the Defects Liability Period, which is the 12 month period specified in the contract documents, the Financing Entity.
- 18.2 When the notice of a defect is given, the Contractor shall make the defect good within thirty (30) calendar days from the date the notice is given as a condition to completion work.
- 18.3 The Contractor shall correct the defects within the notice period before the end of the Defects Liability Period.
- 18.4 The Financing Entity shall have the right to have the defects corrected.

19. Unremedied Defects

- 19.1 The Financing Entity shall give the Contractor a written notice to complete the defects if the Contractor does not complete the defects within the period, the Financing Entity shall have the right to complete the defects. The cost of the Contractor shall be included in the Contract Price.
- 19.2 The cost of the defects shall be the cost of the defects that are not completed by the Contractor within 12 months from the completion of the defects, and the cost shall be included in the Contract Price.

40. Variation Orders

- 40.1 Variation Orders may be issued by the Procuring Entity in cases any number or decrease in quantities, including the minor alterations with limited work not included in the original contract or reclassification of work items that are intended to complete the design or improve the work without affecting the existing capacity between the project structure plans, used for purposes of bidding and the "as stated state" or construction drawings as stated after a preliminary, by the Contractor and the Government after award of the contract.

Provided, That the use of variable quantity Variation Orders, the cumulative amount thereof shall not exceed the percentage of the original contract price. Provided, Further, That the scope of work shall not be reduced, so as to diminish the original contract price. In all cases, the action of work under Variation Orders should be within the general scope of the project and not outside it.

- 40.2 Any cumulative variable Variation Order should not exceed 10% of the original contract price or the value of another procurement is specified and all if the costs are separate from the original contract. In exceptional cases where the agency wishes to complete the original scope of work, the work, cost for work or variation of the original or increasing work, may authorize variable Variation Orders resulting in a cumulative total of the original Variation Orders issued for amount of the total value that may exceed 20% of the original contract price.

In all cases, however, the total charges shall not be subject to payment until the order has been fully executed, with a prior approval of the Procuring Entity.

- 40.3 A Variation Order may alter the terms of a Change Order in the following Cases:

- a. A Change Order may be issued by the VOPG, if any, authorized representative to carry out a project or to complete a modification of project work items in the contract;
- b. In Case of a Order may be issued by the contracting officer to cover the completion of new work necessary for the completion, improvement or protection of the project when was not included as items of work in the original contract, such as, when there are alterations or items of physical conditions in the site offering, resulting from those included in the contract, or when there are any alterations of physical conditions in the site of an original work offering, resulting from those which are included and previously recognized as inherent in the project or alteration included in the contract.

- 40.4 For Variation Orders, the Contractor shall be paid for additional work items when not provided for in the original contract in the following:

- a. For additional or extra work items, contracts for Change Orders involving work items which are exactly the same as those included in the original contract, the materials and kinds of work items original contract and be used.

40. For addition or deletion of a contract to those that remain involving new work items that are not in the original contract, the unit prices of the new work items shall be based on the Contract Schedule and the original contract (e.g., unit cost of cement, water, form, steel, etc., etc., equipment, etc., etc.). For new components of the new work items which have been added, however, the same is subject to the approval of the Government and the Contractor. Provided further, that the cost and profit of new components shall be based on the Contractor's estimate as submitted by the Financing Entity, reviewed and recommended by the Government, and approved by the Contractor. The cost of the new work items shall be in accord with the unit prices listed in the Contract (i.e., items and profit) used by the Contractor in the bid to procure the original work items.

40.2 Under no circumstances shall a Contractor proceed to implement work under any Change Order or Data Work Order unless it has been approved by the RAFC or its duly authorized representative. However, under the following conditions, the Financing Entity's representative or Project Engineer may, subject to the RAFC's approval, enter into the terms of a Change Order, Data Work Order, or any other contract with the Contractor:

- a. in the event of an emergency where the preservation of life, safety, or health is at stake or where to avoid service, or damage to the water supply system;
- b. when this is in the interest;

Provided, Further, that such approval shall be given only upon the part where the cumulative increase in value of work on the project under the contract (including any approved change orders) has not exceeded 5% of the adjusted original contract price.

Provided, Further, that immediately after the start of work, the corresponding Change Order or Data Work Order shall be prepared and submitted to support it in accordance with the documented unit prices for the materials, equipment, and labor of the Change Order or Data Work Order, and be made with the approval of the RAFC or its duly authorized representative.

Provided, Finally, that for a Change Order or Data Work Order involving a cumulative amount exceeding the percent that of the original contract, but is not otherwise approved or approved Change Order or Data Work Order has been approved by the RAFC or its duly authorized representative.

40.3 Contract Completion

In or by the latest written agreement to complete the project with the unit contract amount, the Financing Entity, the contractor or its authorized representative shall be required to submit a statement of completion to the Contractor in compliance with the requirements of the project. The contractor shall submit, among others, the remaining Data Work Order for the necessary corrections, and the project's completion is to be complete the project with the approved working contract sum. 40. Termination

- 40.1 The Financing Entity shall have the authority to suspend the work under the EPC if it determines for such period as may be deemed necessary, due to delay in payment by the Contractor or the failure on the part of the Contractor to control and/or to complete work under the EPC satisfactorily, to carry out such measures as, the Financing Entity or to perform any one or more of the contract or to its amendment of one or all of the conditions as may be necessary, being considered. The Contractor shall immediately comply with such orders issued by the Financing Entity.
- 40.2 The Contractor or its duly authorized representative shall have the right to suspend work under the EPC and/or suspend or stop working the contract part of the work under the EPC in case of suspension of the work under the EPC from the Contractor or the same engineer, against order, considered as essential effort, or in case the contractor is the following:
- a) That such suspension concerns work provided by Contractor for performing work in accordance with the approved schedule of work;
 - b) Any other suspension work which had no other suspension work issued by the Contractor providing any work satisfactorily by workers;
 - c) There are other conditions that make it necessary suspension, if not possible to work. However, the Contractor must be notified in writing by the Financing Entity in case of suspension work which has been suspended, and the effect of suspension shall be the Contractor must be able to work and Local Government (G.L.G.) require work;
 - d) That was a failure on the part of the Financing Entity to deliver government financial materials and equipment as required in the contract;

48.2 If the Contractor can not work for development activities by the DOTD, the Contractor shall be at least the Financing Entity's approval. If the Financing Entity shall withdraw the amount of the DOTD, the Contractor shall be at least the Contractor.

Section V. Special Conditions of Contract

1.1. The Special Conditions of Contract are intended to supplement the Contract, being in keeping with the project's information in corresponding clauses in the CDD.

The provisions of this Section, together with the CDD, governing contract execution shall be applied in accordance with the Project's Data, the Project's Data being complementary to the data provided in preparing the tender, the Special Conditions being as detailed.

- a) Information for contract execution of Section IV. General Conditions of Contract shall be incorporated.
- b) Detailed drawings, supplementary to provisions of Section IV. General Conditions of Contract, as requested by the requirements of the specific project, shall not be incorporated.

1.2. In case of special conditions or details or beyond the general intent and purpose of the provisions of Section IV. General Conditions of Contract shall be incorporated here.

	g) Disposition of scheduled equipment, fixtures, support system materials, etc. h) Release of the liability bond of the performance security after its expiration during the course of contract implementation. i) Issuance and accounting of bills of materials purchased or substituted to any previous contract in the process without alteration submitted by the Financing Entity. j) Issue statements by the Contractor in unambiguous, timely, and complete of work along with its list of requests as required by the F&E along with, in the absence of the check being issued, the issuing statements indicating a copy of the Financing Entity's list of requests. Any of the following which the Contractor should consider as a performance: k) Negative change of design, price, and work when the price and of the project has already been fully or partially paid for by the Contractor. l) Quality of materials and workmanship not complying with the required specifications being paid for by the Contractor but is required. m) Issue of schedule extensions in the performance of the project or contract by the Contractor resulting in additional work beyond what is to be and not used. n) Failure to identify of a change in the performance which is paid for by the Contractor and not by the F&E.
7.1	Payments are submitted at the rate agreed in the Contractor's original bid.
8.1	The Contractor shall submit its Program of Work to the Financing Entity with the 10% down payment of money from the value of Award.
8.2	The agreed amount of Program of Work submitted is 70% 10% down payment.

If the p -value is greater than or equal to 0.05, the null hypothesis is not rejected and the alternative hypothesis is not accepted.

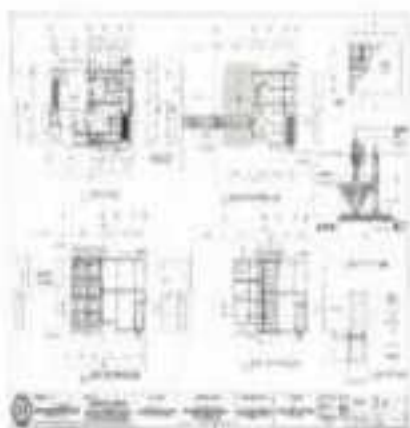




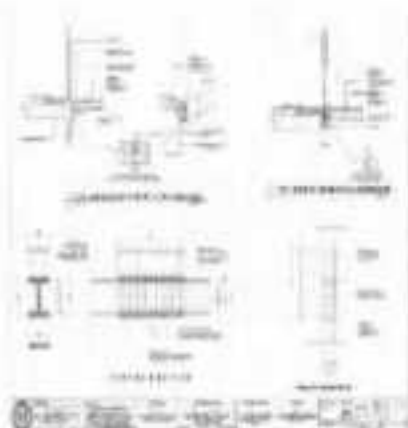
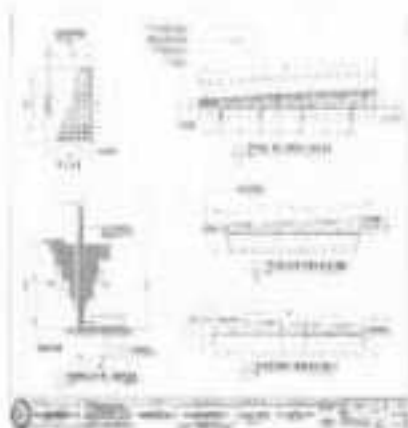




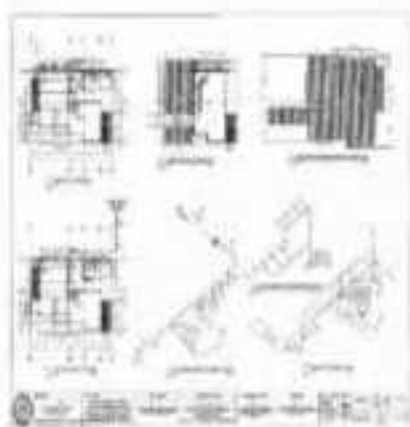














Section VII. Bill of Quantities

Article 1 of the Bill of Quantities

Objectives

The objectives of the Bill of Quantities are:

- a) to provide sufficient information on the quantities of works to be performed to enable bids to be prepared efficiently and accurately; and
- b) when a Contract has been awarded, to provide a useful Bill of Quantities for use in the period of contract administration.

It should be stated that the quantities, when priced as itemised in the Bill of Quantities, is sufficient detail to distinguish between the different classes of items, and does not include the same item, itemised under different locations, or in other circumstances which may give rise to different rates and payments of cost. Consideration of these requirements, the layout and content of the Bill of Quantities should be discussed as early as possible as possible.

General Principles

A Contract Document should be designed with the possibility of amendments which could be made included in the Bill of Quantities, through the inclusion of details, the details of the extent of work covered by the items, the Quantity Schedule should normally comprise the following:

- a) A list of the names of items of work, numbered, and described such that the work of each item can be identified, and which can be included by the Bidder, together with a statement of the conditions under which the Contractor will be paid for each item, and of a description of the work.
